Scaffolding as a Teaching Strategy

Vygotsky "...theorized that learning occurs through participation in social or culturally embedded experiences" (Raymond, 2000, p 176) In Vygotsky's view, the learner does not learn in isolation Instead learning is strongly influenced by social interactions, which take place in meaningful contexts Children's social interaction
